

Carbon Emissions Reduction Policy Statement



Fraport Twin Star Airport Management is responsible for operating, managing and developing the two 24-hour gateways to the Bulgarian Black Sea: Varna Airport & Burgas Airport. As an airport operator, the company considers it an utmost priority to provide high service quality and passenger experience by ensuring the presence of modern, high-tech equipment, facilities, infrastructure and technologies at its airports.

Considerable attention is invested in reducing the company's carbon footprint on the environment through actions aimed to optimize the consumption of energy and fuels. In 2018, our activities have generated 11,000 tons of CO₂ emissions. Our estimates show that by 2030, our carbon footprint will increase by 22% to reach 13,000 tons per year.

As an environmentally responsible company, Fraport Twin Star has set itself a Goal:

To reduce CO₂ emissions to the levels of 2015 by year 2030.

This will be achieved through a wide range of specific energy-saving measures and use of renewable energy sources.

Fraport Twin Star commits to undertake a series of sustainable projects in the direction of reducing its carbon footprint. Through various promotional measures, the company will actively engage its employees, airport guests, partners and other stakeholders to equally commit to the goal by their own, individual and collective day-to-day contribution to the responsible use of energy, fuel and water. Fraport Twin Star remains confident that through its joint efforts, the company will be able to raise its environmental management standards, improve its efficiency and overall performance at its two green airports in Varna and in Burgas.
