

Carbon Emissions Reduction Policy Statement

Fraport Twin Star Airport Management (Fraport Twin Star) is responsible for operating, managing and developing the two 24-hour gateways to the Bulgarian Black Sea: Varna Airport & Burgas Airport.

As a socially responsible company, Fraport Twin Star has set itself an ambitious goal

To reduce direct CO₂ emissions to the levels of 2015 by year 2030.

As a subsidiary of Fraport AG, Fraport Twin Star has also made a commitment to

Net zero CO₂ emissions by 2045, achieved without “offsetting”.

The key component of this strategy is a wide range of specific energy-saving measures, undertake a series of sustainable projects in the direction of reducing direct CO₂ footprint as an expansion of electric vehicle fleet (focusing on ground handling) and use of renewable energy sources through the construction of own photovoltaic plans at both airports.

Through various promotional measures, Fraport Twin Star will actively engage its employees, airport guests, partners and other stakeholders to equally commit to the goal and commitment by their own, individual and collective day-to-day contribution to the responsible use of energy, fuel and water.
